As many of you will be aware, the South Worcestershire Development Plan (SWDP) review is in progress and has been delayed several times. It was due to go out to consultation with the residents this month, but has been delayed again. We are yet to receive the new timetable. It is important that we are ready to comment on the plan when it is released. It will have far reaching consequences for the area and includes a proposed 2,000 new homes in the Throckmorton area by 2041, as well as extensions to all the towns. This will leave Pinvin potentially surrounded by new development.

Particularly frustrating for myself and Liz Tucker (District Councillor) is the secrecy around the development of the proposals. While developers and land owners have been able to negotiate with the planning department at Wychavon, residents have been left in the dark since October 2019. It means you do not know how much the original plan has changed, or what the consequences will be for Pinvin. We have repeatedly made the case for the details to be released to residents but have been refused.

What can we do while we wait? The four parish councils in Pinvin ward have been working together to ensure we make the case for why such huge developments in our area are not a good idea, and we will continue to work to ensure your voice is heard. You may have noticed a large sign on the A44 at Lower Moor about the new settlement. When the details are released we will work with you to get our case ready for the inspector.

You can read the current published plans on the website below and it is worth taking some time to read so that we can be prepared for the next stage. As always, any questions, please get in touch.



Pinvin in the Past

June 1953 - Coronation Thoughts

As we prepare to celebrate the longest reign of any monarch in our country to date perhaps we can think of past times. I was requested to find details of references to Pinvin coronation celebrations but have had little joy as my mother's cousins long since moved away from the area and friends were older when they moved into Pinvin. However, one thing a friend told me was that celebrations were held in the Village Hall and the children all had a gift – the boys had coronation mugs and the girls a book about royalty. We mustn't read too much into the sex discrimination of the time!

I expect in most places - town suburbs, villages and hamlets - celebrations were pretty similar: fancy dress contests for children, various races and games (as physical fitness was high in the new Elizabethan mind following the ascent of Everest by Edmund Hilary and Sherpa Tensing), celebratory food – after all, rationing was not yet too distant a memory!

Life carried on much as usual – still food shortages (nothing new under the sun as they say!) but the thought of a coronation for the new era and a young wife and mother for the head of state pleased most people and proved an incentive to get the country back on its feet again after the dark days of war and deprivation. Indeed life did improve for the latter years of the fifties before the excesses of the sixties arrived.

More people had television sets on which to watch the coronation itself, but in black and white of course, and those without a set of their own or one they could watch with neighbours or friends would either stand outside television shops watching the sets there (as they did with football matches etc.) or visit a cinema where they could sit in comfort (with an ice-cream) and look at the big screen where they could see the coronation in glorious technicolour!

I expect those of us around in 1953 will be remembering the place where we happened to be and what we happened to be doing that day. Happy memories I hope as we reflect on the many faithful years of service to the country by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
