Dear Friends.

We could never have been prepared for what it would feel like to live through the days of national mourning which accompanied the death of our beloved Queen Elizabeth II. From the moment that we heard that she had passed away at Balmoral there was an outpouring of grief and sadness, which reflected the high regard that so many people in the home nations and around the world held our Queen. The queues that formed to view her lying in state, the number of people who lined the streets and watched her funeral say everything.

During any time of bereavement and loss, we will feel sad, but this has also been a time of great thankfulness. We give thanks that our Queen had a long and fulfilled life. We give thanks that she supported and encouraged communities and projects that enable people to care for one another and to look out for the vulnerable and those in need. We give thanks that she was ever present in our lives, that people felt as if they knew her despite never meeting her.

For me though, the thing that I most want to give thanks for is the Queen's faith in God and Jesus. She took seriously the teaching of Jesus that the most important thing anyone can do is to love God and love their neighbour. The Queen lived her whole life trying to do exactly that. She loved the people whom she was called to serve and showed this not only on the big, well publicised occasions, but also during smaller, private encounters that are only now coming to light. The Queen put her faith at the centre of everything she did, through her attending services, through her prayers, and by sharing with others what a difference God and Jesus made in her life.

The Queen has left a powerful legacy, not only for our new King, but for all of us. In the weeks and months to come, I wonder how we might serve those in our community, how we might show that we love them and care about them. And I wonder how we might invite God to be a part of our lives too.

We meet at Pinvin Memorial Hall on the third Wednesday of the month starting at 7.30pm. We are a super friendly bunch and welcome new members from all over Worcestershire!

We have had a change to our programme for September and October, with the talk about bee keeping now moved to 19th October. As Pinpoint went to print in September we were instead looking forward to a talk about Worcestershire Federation of WIs historic craft collection.

There are now well over a hundred beautiful items in our Craft Loan Collection which have been given or lent to the WI over the years. They range from the oldest, a beautiful late 19th Century silk evening bag, to expert examples of modern crafts with all decades in between, from tatting to wood turning and from smocking to metal work. Among the most interesting are those which illustrate the early history of the WI's teaching role, and include garments made to show different finishing skills and



techniques, as well as saleable items of the time such as exquisite gloves.
