Throckmorton New Town

From the Parish Council:

We understand a public consultation event, concerning the Throckmorton new town planned development, has been organised by Wychavon District Council and Malvern Hills District Council.

This will be held on Monday 14 November from 2 - 8 pm at Bishampton Village Hall. It is not a

sit down and listen event but the opportunity to view the range of plans and to ask and discuss questions with informed planners and designers.

The public consultation period for the proposed development starts on 1 November and lasts for 6 weeks.

What is the Throckmorton New Town?

The updated SWDP contains proposals to build a new town on the old Throckmorton airfield to the north-east of Pinvin.

There are few details at the time of writing this, but the first stage of the plan proposes 2,000 homes and 10ha of employment land up to 2041, a range of services and facilities including leisure, schools and shops, and a new road link to Pershore station including a pedestrian and cycle link.

Potential for further growth post 2041 includes an additional 3,000 houses. The new town would be accessed from the A44. The SWDP proposes other new towns in addition to Throckmorton, including at Worcestershire Parkway station.

From the County Council:

On 19th October, Wychavon District Council will be voting on the South Worcestershire Development Plan, a 20 year housing and employment strategy that will see over 10,000 homes built in the area, with 5,000 built around Throckmorton airfield. This will have a huge impact on where we live, especially given the pressures our NHS, schools and road system is already under.

The plan now goes out to consultation and the public have their say. This is not a 'done deal' and the inspector will take all comments under consideration. Revisions to plans are always made and we need to make sure that the part of the plan that affects us is commented upon properly and with the right issues expressed.

Public opposition and objections through the consultation process are hugely important. Make your views known to the planners and help prevent a major new town. **From 1 November onwards**, details of the objection process can be found at

Please get your objection in by 5.00 p.m. on Monday 16th December.

If you are unsure exactly what to say on your objection, don't worry - your parish council will be producing some helpful notes to help you and these will be with you asap.

This is a hugely problematic plan for Pinvin as the county council has only just started planning for the impacts on the road system. It is expected that this plan, including the costs, will not be available until after the plan is agreed. So we need to ensure that our objections are in with the inspector so we can reduce the numbers of houses and hopefully, make the idea of a new town unviable.

Pinvin Arboretum

We have had a busy term so far at school. The children have taken part in a London Mini Marathon, raised funds for charity at our Macmillan coffee morning and added to our PTA funds through a non-uniform day.

Life in the classroom is as varied and creative as ever, with our younger children hopping, skipping and jumping through their first PE lessons, learning how to make moving vehicles or creating their own stories about "How to Hide a Dog at School"!
