Dear Friends,

Do you ever get asked what you do? For some that can be an easy question to answer. For others it might be more complicated. I get asked this question a lot. So, Claire, what is it that you do? It's often hard to know where to start. Most people guess that I can be busy on a Sunday, and that I take baptism services, weddings, and funerals. And some might know that I go into our schools to lead collective worship and share in the life of the schools as a governor. My parents often pull my leg and say that I also seem to attend a lot of meetings!

I do all of that, and most of it locally. I also have responsibilities in the diocese, the wider family of the Church which our parish belongs to. But I also have national responsibilities as I am an elected member of something called General Synod. This is a big meeting made up of people from all over the country. General Synod makes decisions about all sorts of things, including what happens in our churches. It also has discussions about current topics that are important for all of society, including climate change, the cost of living crisis, gambling and young people, to name just a few.

General Synod met in February and many of you will have read about what we did. We discussed the idea of the Church being able to bless same sex couples in churches. This proposal was passed, for which I am very thankful. But the reality is that whilst lots of people up and down the country are pleased by this news, there are many for whom this is difficult news. Sometimes it is just hard for everyone to agree because our consciences won't allow it, our understanding of God and faith won't allow it. If that's the case, then we need to be able to find ways to disagree well and to be kind to one another.

And I suppose that's another thing that I hope I can do. To give people the space to share what they think about same sex blessings and all sorts of things. I want to listen well and encourage others to listen well too so that whatever we feel about any issue we can journey together, loving and respecting one another at all times.

## News and messages from around Pinvin

### **Worcestershire County Council**

This month I met with the Highways liaison team and the traffic safety team to discuss the current issues on Main Street during school drop off and pick up. We witnessed a number of situations that were clearly an issue and the two teams will discuss them. Unfortunately there is no easy fix at this stage.

I know there are a number of suggestions people have made in the past. Several are unfortunately not possible. Firstly, the road cannot have a weight restriction applied. I have had this discussion several times and the Highways team would not be able to create a suitable alternative route for several businesses. It would also be very difficult to police as some farm vehicles would be exempt and would still pass through. As a result, the police would not support this approach. It is also not possible to add traffic calming measures on the road. The council currently does not add infrastructure to the road unless there is evidence from incidents where someone is injured. Currently there are none reported to the police, so the road is deemed safe (as frustrating as this is, near misses are not reported, recorded or considered - the law needs changing but that is for another time!).

The idea of a 20mph zone through the village is being considered. The parish council wrote to the county council some time ago and they are currently undergoing a review of the use of these zones. These reviews do take time but as soon as we hear more we will report back.

A number of people have suggested opening the car park of the village hall. At the moment this is impractical as it would require volunteers. They would need training and insurance so it will cost money. The hall car park cannot be left open all the time as we have had issues of illegal encampments on the site in the past and it costs thousands of pounds to have them evicted. People would need to be willing to take ownership of this task and the school does not have the resources to do this. The village hall is run by a very small number of dedicated volunteers who are not available to do this. The hall is a charity and relies on the hard work of a small number of people- if people are able to get involved in the running of the hall, I know they would appreciate your input. Please email them at pinvinvillagehall@gmail.com if you are able to help.

The other area that we are looking at is finding ways to reduce the number of car journeys to school. Parents and the school are campaigning for better bus services from some neighbouring villages and we are hoping that will be successful. We are also looking at ways to promote walking and cycling to school.


exercising our bodies, doing the steps, and minds, remembering them!
