I am writing this piece while on a weekend break in the city of Liverpool, and have visited some amazing sights in this lovely City of Music. As a weekly visitor to Worcester Cathedral for choir practice, I have not felt the need to visit either of the two cathedrals of Liverpool in the short time of our stay, but maybe can do on another trip, as the city is certainly a place with a lot to recommend it.

Anyone under the age of forty may not realise the significance of Liverpool as the birthplace of the Beatles, and the change in the music scene that came about in the early to mid 1960's. We strolled down Mathew Street, where the Cavern Club saw this birth, and still celebrates it. On the opposite side of the narrow street is a wall of fame, showing musicians who have appeared at the club during its life. Imagine my glee seeing the names of local legends Robert Fripp and Toyah (no surname needed!) on adjacent bricks on the wall of fame!

Liverpool is full of commemorative statues and memorials, understandably mostly dedicated to the victims of warfare, and especially relating to the maritime history of Liverpool as a port. We will join in our annual recognition of the sacrifice of all victims of warfare in our **Service of Remembrance in November**, and I for one will be thinking of the names and lives carved on the memorial tablets and statues that I have seen

during my weekend break, and raising a prayer of thanks.

We enjoyed our **Harvest Service** on 15th October, led by Jayne Parker taking her first service on her own! We're pleased that Jayne knew we would support her leadership that day and, we hope, for many more services to come. Special thanks must also go to Jeanette Dawe for the **flowers** and **autumn displays** decorating the church, porch and font, and also to Stella Elliott who baked a wonderful **harvest sheaf loaf**. Parish Council News

New clerk at the council



This year has seen a few changes in the parish council. Carole, our clerk, has decided to move on. We would like to wish her good luck and say thank you for all the hard work. **We have appointed Lisa Cope as our new clerk.** Lisa is also clerk in Peopleton, is very experienced and is looking forward to getting involved in village life. Grass and Maintenance in Village

As you may have noticed we have had a somewhat wild year in the village, with the grass and green spaces having grown more than we would have liked. The two big issues we have faced are the grass contract and hiring a new lengthsman to undertake maintenance. The old contract for the grass cutting came to an end at the beginning of this year and coincided with huge increases in costs from contractors. As a result we had three very different prices when tenders were submitted.

We also faced some issues with what land we would be mowing as the council has tried in the past to keep the village to the same standard throughout. Unfortunately we received some legal advice that we had to investigate and this delayed the overall contract. This meant we could not sign the new contract until after the election period and once we had fully ensured we were legally compliant. By this point the grass was out of control and this year has been about getting it back to a suitable standard.

With the new contractor the quote was considerably lower in order to provide best value for money for Pinvin residents. There have been a few teething problems with the quality and location of the grass cutting and the Parish council has liaised with the new company to put this right on several occasions during this year's grass cutting season. This should all be resolved going forward but the council will continue to monitor the situation and take action where appropriate.

We have also appointed a new lengthsman to maintain the green spaces in the village. The lengthsman scheme is paid for by the county council and is to help parishes maintain areas within the 30mph zone of villages. Our new lengthsman is keen to get work underway and we are hoping we will be able to get on top of issues as quickly as we can. If there are any green spaces you are concerned about please do contact the clerk Lisa, who will be more than happy to help.

Storm Babet

At the time of writing, our small lakes have returned in Owletts Lane and Spion Kop. We have also had continued issues on the A44. Highways have kept the drains clear prior to the storm but we experienced up to 70mm of rain overnight on 19th October which none of our drains are designed to withstand. There have also been a couple of issues discovered further along the drains that need resolving and the highways team are investigating.

During intense periods of rainfall the drainage team prioritise main roads and those that are most prone to extensive flooding. While immensely frustrating for us, I have to thank the team who have worked incredibly hard to keep as many roads open as possible.

In the long-term, these types of storms are becoming more common. Once we have dealt with the flooding, I will be arranging a meeting to talk to our drainage team to consider how we can look at the capacity of the drains locally. If there are any areas you think need to be addressed, please let me know.

County Hall remains open

Again, at the time of writing, a significant amount of County Hall has been closed as aerated concrete (known as RAAC) has been discovered in the building. While engineers survey the building, reception is closed.

You can still access the building and the registry office is still open. We are expecting an update in November to establish what will need to be done to the building.

Pinvin in the Past

A HOME IN PINVIN – THEN AND NOW

At the time of writing we mourn the loss of a gentleman who lived in Pinvin for many years along with his wife and was regularly seen walking to services at St. Nicholas Church. That man was Clive Kateley. My husband and myself had the privilege of living nearby for several years and were shown many kindnesses by both.

Another family who had lived in the same house had the surname Cole. They were there over one hundred years ago – during the 1891 Census - but had moved away (still in Pinvin) by 1901. In fact, that was the very house where my grandmother spent her early years along with a few of her siblings and had attended the village school and Sunday school as indeed had both her parents.

I must admit with this knowledge it did feel strange the first time I visited Clive and Kath although, of course, the house would have changed a great deal from the time when my ancestors were there. It had been more than twenty years since that little girl of the previous century had died but I know if she had still been around there would have been many stories she would have been able to tell me.

One she mentioned was how when she was a baby her eldest brother had been told to take her out in her perambulator. But his baby brother had died



when just a year old and he DID NOT WANT A SISTER, so he pushed her down into the ford. I never was told the rest of the story i.e. how she was rescued or by whom (maybe her brother had a change of heart) but ever after they were close pals.

You will be missed by many, Clive.
